### ***Newly elected Trustees at our AGM***

We were delighted to see many of you at the Friends of the William Hogarth School Annual General Meeting (AGM) earlier in November. A very warm welcome to everyone who joined our meeting to hear more about our work for this upcoming school year, and who voted for our newly elected Trustees. We were delighted to elect new Trustees: Oliver Allen (Treasurer), Erica Belanger (Secretary), Andrea Visus and Lisa de Laroy. We would like to take this opportunity to thank our outgoing Chair Isma Adams for her invaluable contribution and commitment to our work over the past year. ### ***Our Fundraising Provides Grants to our School***

With your support, we raised £12,000 last year for the benefit of the pupils at the school. Each event helps provide additional equipment and resources for the children. Thank you for your continuing support. At our AGM, we presented how our funds were allocated to the school last year. We were able to provide grants to the following:

- Cameras to document learning outcomes (£600)
- Writing stimulus books (£600)
- School lights for performances (£200)
- Nursery Mud Kitchen (£400)
- Visualisers (modern OHPs) (£900)
- Plants in every classroom (£400)
- Teacher's spending fund (£2,400)
- Environmental Fund (£500)
- Outdoor space including the building of a meadow and sensory garden (£7,000)

This year, our Trustees will consult with all parents towards our upcoming Termly Meeting in January 2020 to allocate grants to our school's needs. Please do join us to have your say on where we spend our money. Discussion will include consideration to support:

- Information Communication Technology (ICT) equipment including Chromebooks
- "Learning Kitchen" with specialised cooking equipment including mini ovens
- Outdoor space including a new play structure.

### ***TONIGHT!! Quiz Night***

We hope to see you at our annual Adults-only Quiz Night from 7.00 pm tonight (quiz starts at 7.30pm). This is the only event in the PTA calendar which is just for parents and teachers (sorry, no children at this event). Tickets are £10 (including pizza!), and there will be a cash bar and raffle. If you haven't bought a ticket yet, don't worry you can always buy your ticket at the door.

Each year the quiz raises around £500 for the school, which last year was used to purchase writing stimulus books for each class. This year, proceeds from will be used to equip a 'learning kitchen' in the school with mini ovens and catering sets for the children. We understand that babysitting can be difficult to arrange, but it would be lovely to see as many of you as possible at this fun event if you can make it. The quiz will finish around 10pm.
