

Joel Donovan: Chair of Governors: The William Hogarth School is a terrific institution. It benefits from a wonderfully diverse and inspiring pupil body, a loyal and caring staff, a dynamic Friends of the School, a committed Governing Board and a supportive local education authority. It is my privilege to be able to work with all of them, having succeeded Andy Rooney as Chair in 2018.
